DEVARIM: WORDS FROM RABBI DAVID DUNN BAUER



In Mishnah Pei-ah 1:1, the Sages write: "These are the obligations without measure, whose reward, too, is without measure:

To honor father and mother;

to perform acts of love and kindness;

to attend the house of study daily;

to welcome the stranger;

to visit the sick;

to rejoice with bride and groom;

to console the bereaved;

to pray with sincerity;

to make peace when there is strife.

V'talmud torah k'neged kulam... And the study of Torah is equal to them all, because it leads to them all."

These are the obligations of individuals, but also of communities. We fulfill some of them with relative ease and spontaneity: boundless rejoicing at the wedding of friends often feels like a privilege rather than an obligation. The mitzvah of kibud horim -- honoring our parents -- has (despite its being the endless source of Borscht Belt humor) a clarity and value to it that call us to its fulfillment.

Personally, I get bewildered contemplating some of the others.

"Welcome the stranger" -- Every stranger? All the time? "Visit the sick" -- That's depressing. Shouldn't their families be taking care of them? "Praying with sincerity" -- I don't always feel confident in prayer. If I go through the motions, is that sincere enough?

As I review the list, I realize that all of these mitzvot are easier to accomplish when I'm not alone. The more people at a wedding, the more freylikh (joyful) the dancing. The more I share the task of visiting people who are ill, the less awkward or burdened I feel. The more people at services or Torah study, the greater my experience of revelation. The more members of the community who commit to making peace, the greater likelihood I will restructure my life to bring peace wherever I can.

One of the reasons we maintain Jewish community is to keep from feeling isolated in our efforts to fulfill these mitzvot. If engaging in our obligations is lonely, if we derive more suffering than satisfaction, we burn out, and

our obligations go completely unmet. We need each other in order to reap the rewards without measure that the mishnah promises.

A JCA goal for this year is to increase membership participation in all aspects of our communal and in-

stitutional life. The prospect of fuller engagement from all of us is profoundly exciting.

Being present before services to greet newcomers and help orient them to the synagogue is simple and very meaningful work. Welcoming strangers, directing them to the coat room and to the sanctuary, answering questions about the congregation and the building, these are not superficial gestures, they are the essential elements of *hachnasat orchim* -- welcoming guests.

I particularly am looking for more people who are ready to give time and energy towards visiting the sick. A lot of JCAers have spent time in the hospital or have been homebound with illness this past year. I and the Chesed Committee need fuller lists of volunteers who are ready to visit, spend time, and bring love and kindness to members of all ages who are ill and need support.

The JCA benefits tremendously from lay leadership in prayer and study. I love to lead services, but I love to be led as well. Some of the most moving worship experiences I can remember have been while learning Torah from, and sharing prayer responsibility with, members of the JCA. If you think you might like to offer a d'var Torah or lead even a single prayer at Shabbat services, please let me know.

Open to the Community on Sunday, February 3

The World Wide Wrap – imagine Jews around the world wrapping themselves in tallit and tefillin- our Religion Committee member, Rhonda Shapiro-Rieser helps connect us to this effort. In addition, as part of b'nai mitzvah preparation, students learn about a variety of Jewish mitzvot and traditions for prayer observance. On Sunday, February 3 from 10-11:45am, Rabbi Bauer will lead a workshop for 6th graders and their parents on the use of the tallit, tying tzitzit (fringes) and the practice of wearing tefillen (phylacteries). How to help everyone feel comfortable studying and interpreting Torah? We study bible stories in grades 1 & 2. On Sunday, January 6, Sixth grader, Lily Harris led the way for her classmates, as she shared her interpretation of Torah with a series of pictures depicting Pharoah and some of the plagues. Scheduled for January 27 was Cody Edgerly. Over the next few weeks, each sixth grader will give a dvar Torah as practice before preparing for leading the congregation, as they become b'nai mitzvah in the upcoming year. The class also includes Lily Blain, Ben Sarat, Henry Abramowitz, Matty Severin, and Madison Coutoure.

The Oxford Union's Destructive "Debate"

In October of 2007 I wrote an obituary for the Oxford Union. This student-run group purports to be one of the most distinguished debating societies in the world. Yet its debates have become more one-sided, more absurd, and more trivial than most bar room brawls.

The scheduled debate that led me to write the October obituary was supposed to be on the following proposition: "This house believes that one state is the only solution to the Israel-Palestine conflict." Nothing wrong with that (other than that no one would dream of proposing a similar topic with regard to India-Pakistan-Bangladesh or any of the other divided states in the world today).

The problem was with the debaters selected by the Oxford Union to defend the two-state solution, which is synonymous with Israel's right to exist.

One of the speakers selected to represent the pro-Israel side was Norman Finkelstein, who was recently fired from DePaul University for his lack of scholarship and his ad hominems against pro-Israel writers (including

me). The other debater selected to represent the pro-Israel side refused to appear

with Finkelstein on the same side and so the debate was cancelled.

Now the Oxford Union has gone even further. It has scheduled a debate on January 24 on whether Israel has the right to exist. Both speakers on the supposed pro-Israel side are virulent Israel-haters and strong supporters of Palestinian terrorism.

One is Norman Finkelstein, who is currently joining hands with the Lebanese terrorist group Hezbollah, whose goal is the military destruction of Israel. Finkelstein supports Hezbollah and says that this terrorist organization "represents the hope." He has previously regretted not being more supportive of Hezbollah in its military attacks on Israel. And he was selected to be one of the two pro-Israel advocates. With friends like these...

The other invited speaker is just as

bad. He is a philosophy professor named Ted Honderich, who believes that the Palestinian terrorists have "a moral right in their terrorism against Israelis." He analogizes Israel to Apartheid South Africa, which he of course said did not have a right to exist. Yet he too has been selected to speak on behalf of Israel.

The Oxford Union had it within their power to select a genuine advocate of Israel's right to exist, since even in England there are a few of those. I know, because I have been getting outraged letters from Oxford students, alumni and ordinary citizens about the forthcoming debate. For example, one of Great Britain's most distinguished lawyers and writers is Anthony Julius. He could make an effective case for Israel's right to exist, as could many other prominent individuals.

But at the Oxford Union, the only debate permitted is over the means used to end Israel's existence; whether Israel should be destroyed by Palestinian suicide bombers, by Hezbollah rockets or by some other means. This is not a public debate. It is a public execution


