# Why Moses Said Yes and You Should Too

Shalom 2010, a new year, a new decade, and a fresh start. This month, the new JCA board begins its work on behalf of the community. There are lots of issues to tackle together, including: maintaining a balanced budget, planning a new budget for 201/2012, hiring a new rabbi, helping things go smoothly during the rabbi's sabbatical, planning a new system for the kitchen that includes a volunteer initiative, staging a Grand Auction in March as well as other fundraising initiatives, maintaining a strong school and education program, supporting Project Rehovot, and many other ef forts - lar ge and small. Thank you to every one of our volunteers as well as our incredible staff for all your dedication and enthusiasm.

It's easy, during these dark, cold winter days to want to wait for warmer weather to get reengaged in the community. It is exactly during this time that working together can be so bene f cial for yourself and for everyone. Take Moses as an example of a reluctant volunteer who went from ambivalence to become a great leader.

Reading through the upcoming parshiot in Exodus, I realized that Moses was the ultimate reluctant volunteer, but why did he eventually say "yes"? What motivated him to leave the comfort of his home, f rst in Egypt and then again in Midian, to do things for the betterment of his people? How can we har ness that energy to continue to move the JCA ahead?

Moses was raised as a wealthy Prince of Egypt and believed that his life would be one of comfort and riches with very little ef fort until things began to change within him. His Jewish mother, the source of many childhood values, as well as many a guilty conscience, raised him as a nurse in the palace. She clearly inf uenced him to develop into more than

just a warrior prince. Next he saw the injustice of a Hebrew slave being beaten, which forced Moses to respond, based on his inner principles to slay the Egyptian overseer. Banished from Egypt as punishment, wandering in the desert, and finding a home with Jethro and Zipporah, seemed to make Moses complacent after his ordeal. Once in Midian and established with a wife and family he seemed happy as a shepherd until Hashem spoke to him at the burning bush and ASKED him to return to Egypt and free his people. Moses doubted his ability, but Hashem gave him some miraculous signs to perform to convince Pharaoh: a rod that became a snake, a leprous and then cleansed hand, and turning the river to blood. Still doubting, Hashem made it so that Aaron, his brother, could speak for Moses on behalf of the people. By that point, Moses was already the "Chair of the Committee" if not the "Chairman of the Board" itself leading the way out of Egypt and to the promised land.

So what happened and how can we at the JCA relate? Well, we all may not want to leave our warm homes at times, but each of us is directed by that small voice that says "when something needs to be done take action and do it". Second, it is easier to respond if someone asks you to do something, even if there is no burning bush on your front lawn. Finally, Moses was fully engaged once he had his brother – as a companion and a spokesperson. We have all these things at the JCA: We know it's the right thing to do to help the community, we have people who are asking for our help, and we have those we care about to share the work. So each of us is Moses in our own way and by working together, we can accomplish miracles and move the community to the place that's right for us.

#### It Doesn't Get Any Better Than This...

Some mornings, you just have to be around to appreciate the many ways our JCA School community comes together and how many different ways things can go right. Such was December 13, 2009. Parents and volunteers were cooking latkes and preparing the Social Hall for the afternoon's Hannukah party. Some other parents were packing boxes in the lobby for young soldiers serving in Iraq. In another room, Rhonda Shapiro-Rieser was facilitating a support group for parents of children with special needs. The classrooms were flled with teachers, conducting a range of activities to engage their students. I had read their lesson plans and worked with teachers to offer Hannukah themed programming for a variety of learning styles. Students learned history related to Hannukah, listened to & compared traditional and hip hop versions of Hannukah songs, made Hannukah decorations, and listened to stories. # Rabbi Search Meeting Results

The Rabbi Search meeting on Sunday, Dec. 6th was attended by approximately 80 members of the congregation. The responses to "What are you looking for in a new rabbi?" had a great deal of overlap, so the Community Engagement Committee identif ed common threads and combined similar responses into 15 clusters of characteristics. By adding up the number of "votes" within each cluster, we were able to form a prioritized list of the most desired qualities for a JCA rabbi.

Please note that:

- no one on the Community Engagement Committee is a statistician
- because we participated in the process we felt that we could reliably interpret the intent of some of the comments (e.g. does a "spiritual leader" put the emphasis on spirituality or leadership?)
- not everyone at the meeting voted for 3 items so the numbers do not add up neatly
- items that were written down--but did not have votes-are recorded, but not included in totals.

If you would like to view the raw data, it is available on the JCA website in two forms. One is a list of all the written responses from the meeting in order of the number of votes they received ("Ranked Feedback"). The other is a listing of responses by cluster ("Clustered Feedback").

The prioritized list of characteristics (with number of votes) follows:

Builds community within JCA (30 votes)

Inspiring spiritual service leader (27 votes)

Rapport with children (20 votes)

Charisma (14 votes)

Scholarly type (14 votes)

Mensch (13 votes)

Music (11 votes)

Social justice (11 votes)

Emotional maturity (10 votes)

Open-minded (not an ideologue) (8 votes)

Administrative skills (6 votes)

Has their own spiritual practice/depth (6 votes)

Leadership skills (6 votes)

Strong educator (6 votes)

Pastoral counseling (3 votes)
