June offers several community-wide events that will interest our families. On June 6th, the Board will gather the community for the Semi-Annual Meeting. A special program is planned for your input on leadership development and community engagement.

Then on June 12th, after services we will hold a big farewell Kiddush for Rabbi Bauer. Many of us had the opportunity to wish him well on the last day of JCA school. Summer Support Makes a Difference

April 21, 2010 Dear Friends at JCA,

On January 19th, Martin Luther King Day, The Literacy Project's Amherst classroom moved to JCA. Working with volunteers from Amherst College, Amherst High School, Smith College, Greenfield Community College and the local community, we were able to start classes at JCA the very next day. Since that date we have been very happy to hold our classes in the beautiful library and Hebrew School classroom on Monday through Friday mornings. Our teachers, volunteer tutors and adult GED students are enjoying the space very much.

Here are a few examples of the work our students at the JCA are doing:

- Two students have said that they finally feel comfortable sending text messages to their friends, because they are now proud of how they write.
- One student set up her first email account so she can email her nephews in Afghanistan.
- One student started her first "on the books" job and has been doing very well.
- In the GED class, students are learning to calculate percent interest on loans, bank accounts, and credit cards, a skill that will help them pass the GED exam; and they can use in their lives.

I'm sure you know that these are difficult times for local nonprofits. With state and federal revenue down, social service agencies are under pressure to meet more needs with fewer resources. The Literacy Project has had a 45% reduction in our revenue for Amherst.

We've had a wonderful relationship with our former landlord, Gillen and Associates, but sharing space with the JCA helps us to keep our costs down while we keep the doors of opportunity open for our students. The JCA has been extremely welcoming, and we hope that we've been able to create a collaboration that benefits both communities.

While Amherst has a high percentage of residents with advanced education, those at the other end of the educational spectrum have few options. 1 in 7 residents in the Pioneer Valley do not have a GED or high school diploma. Without a diploma or GED, a woman living in Hampshire County can only expect to earn \$17,000 – not enough to survive without public subsidy.

The Literacy Project is an independent non-profit agency offering free adult literacy and GED classes in Amherst, Northampton, Greenfield, Orange, and Ware, and serving students throughout the region since 1984. 
